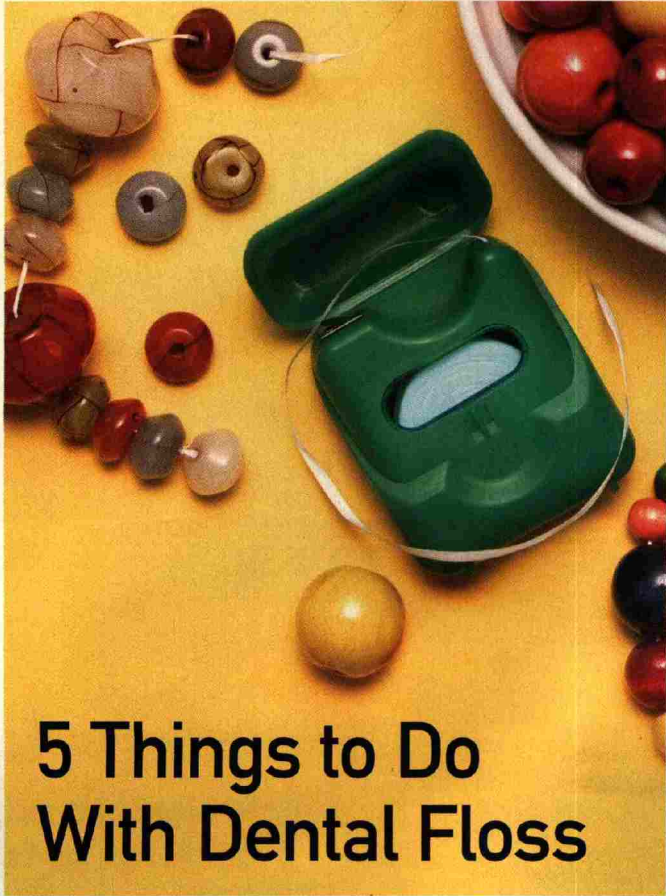

5 Things to Do With Dental Floss

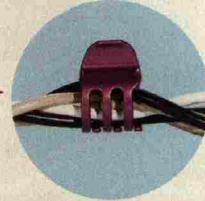
- 1 Slide under cookies to loosen them from a baking sheet.
