For the greenie on your list

Well, it may not be sexy, and it won't fit in a stocking, but it is a great gift for the environmentalist/gardener on your shopping list. Now you can harvest rainwater in this Tuscan style rain barrel made by Fiskars.

With Florida's reduced rainfall the past few years, keeping flowers and veggies flourishing can be a costly proposition.

A 1,000 square foot roof in an area that receives as little as 20 inches of rain annually can shed 12,000 gallons of fresh, free water each year. What's more, rainwater is healthier for plants than treated "city water", since it contains far less chlorine and salt. Even better, capturing rainwater from a rooftop prevents the erosion and water quality problems associated with heavy run-off.

Designed to integrate into existing downspouts, the Collection System diverts

rain from gutters into a covered barrel where the extra water is stored until needed.

The Rainwater Collection System includes a rain barrel cover, base stand, and spigot assembly as well as two diverters designed to fit the two most common gutter dimensions. After installation, it takes as little as two-tenths of an inch of rain on a typical roof to fill the Collection System. When the barrel is full, the diverter allows excess rainwater to continue through the downspout and away from your home, protecting your home's foundation.

The Tuscan model (shown) holds 57 gallons and costs \$179.99. It's available also at Amazon.

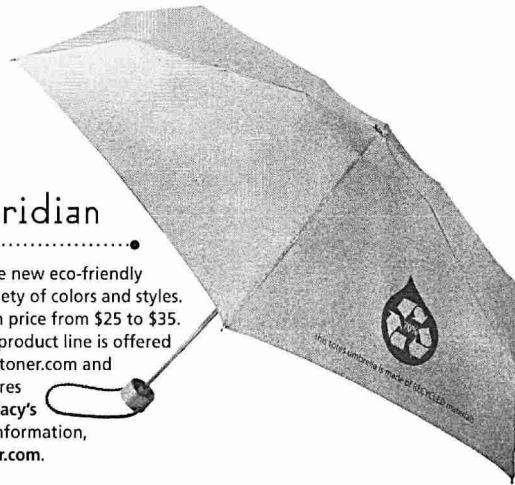

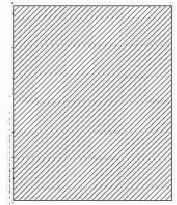
totes ISOTONER has a new line of earth-friendly umbrellas called eco 'brella.

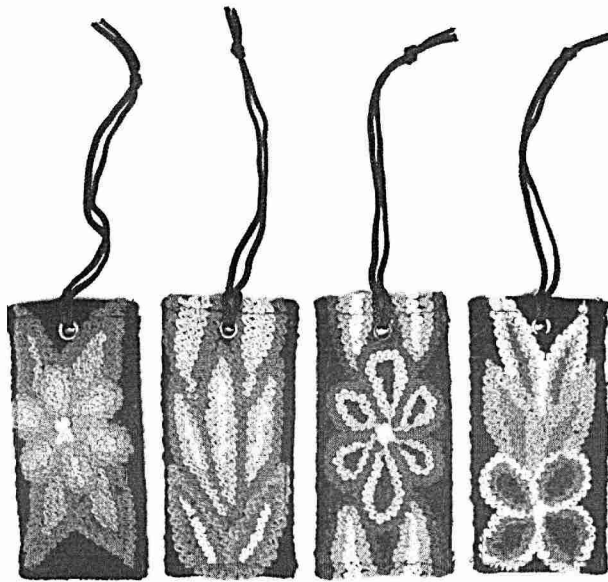
