Why don't kids take showers at school?

ournalists get lots of e-mail from companies wanting articles written about their new and interesting products. But a news release sent my way recently really grabbed my attention. A company called My Kids Stink LLC was touting its QwikShower Gym Class Wipes — essentially mega-sized baby wipes that a teen can use to wipe down his whole body after gym class or sports practice. It got me thinking: When did kids stop taking showers at school? And why?
